Principal's Corner

When I interviewed 5 years ago to work here in Camden I visited the school for a day to get an inside look. This was to help me decide if I was going to move 700 miles back to my home state. Students took me around to various classrooms where I met teachers and asked lots of questions about what it was like to be a student here. I left feeling confident CRMS was a school I wanted to help lead. The foundation of respect and kindness was around every corner. I am grateful Kindness is one of our core values and proud to say we work on developing compassion and empathy in our community while teaching academics.

This month we have some important work to do as we focus on combating bullying while working to be truly kind to all of our community members. Below you will find information from our school counselor, Tanya Young, outlining our work ahead this month.

Kindness Matters - Tanya Young

This month CRMS is focusing on bullying prevention and giving the gift of kindness. There are a number of mini activities and lessons that will be happening throughout March. We kick started the activities on Wednesday with Pink Shirt Day. Students wore pink to take a stand against bullying and also signed a pledge to make a commitment to

- support others who have been hurt or harmed
- treat others with kindness
- be more accepting of people's differences
- help include those who are left out

DAILY KINDNESS CHALLENGE: Each day students will be challenged/encouraged to do as many kind acts as possible. Students may be wondering what is a kind act? For instance, one might put a nice note in your friend's locker, pick up trash to help keep school looking clean, say thank you to a teacher or your principal, or just simply offer a smile to those they pass. During morning announcements students will hear a kindness quote and learn what the challenge will be for the day. Later in the month we will step things up by having students complete "Caught Ya!" cards when they see someone being kind. More information about this will be provided to students at a later date. We encourage parents to check the daily announcements so they can have discussions with students about the quotes and kindness challenges.

TAKING A STAND AGAINST BULLYING CONTEST:

As we are focus on the fight against bullying, we want to hear student ideas about how to best respond to and prevent bullying and what better way to encourage the sharing of ideas than a contest! We want students to answer one or both of the following questions using any form of creative expression they choose such as a story, poem, piece of artwork, video, etc.

- How can you or your peers respond to bullying when it occurs?
- What can you or others do to prevent bullying from happening in the first place?

Students will have until March 15 to enter their creative work into the contest, at which time the contest entries will be judged. Two winners, one from grades 5/6 and one from grades 7/8, will be named that afternoon. Winners will be rewarded with a \$25 gift card. If students are interested in entering the contest, they need to see Mrs. Young for an entry form and further instruction.

GSTA is coming to CRMS!!

What?:

A GSTA (Gay Straight Transgender Alliance) is a student-led organization that provides a safe and supportive environment for LGBTQ+ (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer/Questioning, and related communities) students and their allies and works to create safe and LGBTQ+- inclusive schools. GSTAs work to improve school climate for **all** students, regardless of sexual orientation or gender identity/expression.

Who?:

Grade 5-8 students:

- identifying as lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender
- questioning their sexual orientation, gender identity or the ways in which they express their gender.
- perceived to be LGBTQ+, whether or not they identify as such
- identifying as straight allies with LGBTQ+ relatives, friends or acquaintances.
- concerned about bias and discrimination in the school community

Where?:

The CRMS GSTA will be part of the School Counseling Program and supported by the School Counselor.

When?:


Schooner Time and expanding beyond that as needed (i.e. lunches, after school) based on student need and availability.

Why?:

Need indicated by National, State, and CRMS Data (quantitative and qualitative):

- CRMS students have shown interest and indicated need
- Two years ago we had a large number of students organize to bring awareness to PRIDE month with a Rainbow Dance. Proceeds from the dance were donated to OUT Maine.
- Multiple CRMS students have "come out" during their years at CHRHS, which has an active GSTA.
- Multiple CRMS students have gone on to join the CHRHS GSTA.
- This year multiple students in grades 5-8 have indicated interest in participating in a GSTA because they are bisexual, transgender, or want to support LGBTQ friends.





COUNSELING NEWS



This year our 7th grade students will again be participating in a 4 hour workshop to discuss the limiting and harmful effect of gender pressures that are present in our culture. The boys will participate in the Reducing Sexism and Violence Middle School Program (RSVP) presented by CRMS male staff members that have been trained by Boys To Men to implement the program. While the boys are in their workshop the girls will be having a similar experience in a workshop based on the Miss Representation curriculum presented by two trainers that have experience with the curriculum. Learning Outcomes: Students will be able to

- Utilize their Social Emotional Learning skills to communicate about issues they experience related to limiting stereotypes
- Identify, critique, and analyze media messages and images that are targeted towards them
- Have a stronger awareness of cultural issues and more respect for human dignity and differences

Our first set of gender workshops will take place March 13 for half of our 7th graders. The other half will participate in the workshops on April 3. Each year we find these workshops to be very powerful and thought provoking for our 7th grade students and we are very excited to be able to offer them for this year's class as well. 


CRMS GIRLS COALITION NEWS


