

It's been a great season for fall sports at CRMS! Over 175 sixth, seventh and eighth graders participated in soccer, field hockey, cross country and golf this season. Here are some highlights:

The 7th grade co-ed soccer team won the Busline Championship game against AVS 3 -1.

The girls 8th grade soccer team are won the Busline Championship against Oceanside 3 - 0.

The sixth grade co-ed soccer team advanced to the semi-finals and lost a very hard fought game yesterday against Appleton 1 - 0. The boys 8th grade soccer team also advanced to the semi-finals and lost another hard fought game to Oceanside 1 - 0. The field hockey team advanced to the semi-finals by beating Nobleboro in double overtime and lost to Troy Howard 6 - 0.The Cross-Country boys won the Busline League Championship and the girls came in second. The Golf Team competed in the Busline Championship at Rockland Golf Club.

7TH GRADE NEWS

Over the first months of school, 7th grade students undertook a combined art, science, and writing project focused on answering the question: "How is life interconnected and interdependent?" Over the the course of this study, students had a variety of experiences, including: instruction in scientific drawing and documentation; guided ecological observations at various Coastal Mountains Land Trust locations; field observations to Megunticook Stream; and instruction in sgraffito technique on clay with guest artist Tim Christensen. As well, students received more traditional instruction in science, writing, and art. In science, students learned some of the fundamentals of ecology, including the concepts of symbiosis, energy flow, and disturbance, as applied to the northern forest. At the same time, in art class, they worked to understand how to use various techniques to document their observations of the natural world. In language arts, they learned about the fundamentals of communicating in Claim, Evidence, Reasoning (CER) format. The curricular goals of the study were driven by our art, writing, and science graduation standards. What differed was the integrated, Project-Based Learning (PBL) approach to meeting these standards. In PBL, students engage with real-world problems and challenges, which can be approached from multiple perspectives, and where there are multiple right answers. 

IMPORTANT BUILDING VOTE - NOVEMBER 6TH

MSAD #28 has an important vote coming up on the November 6 ballot regarding the Mary E. Taylor (MET) building. The school district has placed this item on the ballot in response to community interest and desire that taxpayers have the final say in determining whether the MET is torn down or is renovated. On the ballot for approval is a \$4.9 million bond to renovate the building for mixed use - two floors would house some functions currently in the Bus Barn (the Central Office and the high school Alternative Education program) and one floor would be leased out. If the question fails, the building will be torn down and additional athletic fields will be built in its place. In that case, the Five Town CSD would likely pursue alternative options for the Central Office/Alternative Ed program to be located on the high school campus in the near future. It is important for parents to have a voice, so I encourage you to make sure to vote!


