
### **NEW CREW AT CRMS!**










Congratulations to the 25 CRMS students who put themselves to the test this year competing in Continental Math League meets. Our students were included in one of five national regions and we were very pleased with the results from our first year in this forum--not the top, but certainly not the bottom!

Students attended practice sessions after school and then competed by taking a 30-minute set of questions using only pencil and paper. These questions cover calculations, spatial reasoning,

Geometry, and Pre-Algebra topics. They all require careful reading, analysis, and attention to detail. Learning to strengthen these skills is a fantastic way to prepare for future math courses.

### Join us for the Ride of Silence



Every year, the <u>International Ride of Silence</u> is held to honor vulnerable road users who have been injured or killed by traffic violence while bicycling, to raise awareness that bicyclists have a legal right to use the road, and to remind motorists to respectfully share the road with all users.

This year's event will be on **Wednesday, May 19 at 7 p.m.**, and Maine currently has rides scheduled in Augusta, Lewiston, Portland, Rockland, and Saco.

As the official Maine state coordinator for the Ride of Silence, the Bicycle Coalition of Maine is hosting a <u>webpage</u> where you can find information about all the ride locations, general guidelines, registration details, and COVID protocols in place.

The BCM is also hosting the Portland ride, for which <u>registration is NOW OPEN</u>. If you're interested in this ride, here are the details:

Location: CycleMania Parking Lot - 65 Cove Street, Portland, ME

Please DO NOT park vehicles at CycleMania. Use the Park & Ride on Marginal Way or the lot at 1 Diamond Street (across from Coffee By Design).

Check-in: 6:30 p.m.

Ceremony: 6:50 p.m.

Ride: 7:00 p.m.

The ride distance is 3 miles, ride speed does not exceed 10 mph, and there are no drops. For more information on the International Ride of Silence and all the Maine locations, please visit this link—and check back for updates!







### **CHRHS's Annual Plant Sale!**

Last year our regular plant sale did not take place but we were able to get plants to lots of people and donated lots of money to great organizations that are working to build a strong food system. This year we are back to our somewhat normal plant sale. We have had a small but awesome crew of students hard at work to have as many different types of plants available for sale.

The Horticulture & Gardening class's annual sale will take place Saturday, May 15 and Sunday, May 16 at the greenhouse on campus. The sale always takes place the weekend after Mother's Day. The greenhouse is located in back near the loading dock area of the school. Please be aware that we will be limiting the number of people in the greenhouse and masks will be required so you may want to factor in a little extra time for your visit.

We will have lots of vegetable and herb seedlings as well as a wide variety of annuals and perennials. All plants are grown using organic practices and do really well once planted. There are always new varieties, including heirlooms.

In addition to plants we hope to have bags of compost for sale. We are currently assessing whether it is ready for distribution. Each bag is about 40lbs, is high quality, organic compost and sell for \$6 each.

Sale takes place Saturday, May 15 from 8am – 1 pm and on Sunday, May 16 from 9am - noon. All containers are \$3 each. Buy 3 and get a 4th for free. On Sunday everything is buy one, get one free from 9-11 and the last hour everything is \$1.



## Professor Gives Back to Public Education by Cycling Across the United States

Beginning June 6, 2021, Bowling Green State Professor Dr. Chris Willis will embark on a solo cross country cycling expedition across the northern United States to raise money for the 51 school districts that host him along the way.

Willis will be embarking on the Adventure Cycling Association's preplanned <u>Northern Tier Route</u>. The route begins in Anacortes, Washington, and ends in Bar Harbor, Maine. He chose this route because it goes through his university's home city of Bowling Green, Ohio and many scenic areas.

"I love cycling because it is intimate. You're seeing the country at a slow pace," said Willis, "I have driven across the country

before, but it will be exciting to experience it in a new way."

In 2017, Willis, a product of the United States' public education system, decided to cycle across America. Not long after making the decision, he decided to create the Pedal for Public Schools campaign to raise money for public school districts to bring more significance to his ride.

"I want to continue the story of how much power the public schools have," Willis said, "There's a lot of great people who wouldn't be here without the help of others within those schools. Those are the people I'm trying to honor with this ride."

Pedal for Public Schools is a self-funded initiative to thank public schools for their work in educating America's youth. Willis's goal is to write each school district a check to do with as they please. The school districts selected for the donation were decided based on his cycling route.

"My goal at the end of my ride is to get off my bike and start writing checks as a donation from Pedal for Public Schools for their school boards and superintendents to do with it as they wish," Willis said, "I'm not putting any strings on the donation."

"I am privileged to be in a position where...I am able to take this trip, that is all of the more reason that I make sure that I am giving back," Willis said, "I would love to get to a minimum of \$51,000 so I can write 51 \$1,000 checks."


