## FROM THE HEALTH DESK

Influenza "Flu" Vaccine Clinics are being offered at Pen Bay Pediatrics this October on Saturdays- October 1st, 15th, 29th from 8am-1230. Call 301-5600 for an appointment.

Regarding absences, may I request when you inform the school your child is home not feeling well (email is great!), please tell us *what their symptoms are*. If they have cold symptoms, we recommend you test them to rule in/out Covid and let us know the results. This is really helpful.

If your child tests positive for Covid, email the following 2 details:

- 1. What DAY their symptoms STARTED?
- 2. What day they tested positive for Covid?

FREE Covid Tests can be ordered monthly on this website: <u>https://</u><u>www.accesscovidtests.org/</u>

CRMS has test kits for home use and will be happy to distribute them while supplies last.

Pen Bay Healthcare offers drive thru PCR or viral testing for Covid in Rockport. This test picks up the Covid *virus* (different from the home kit or *antigen* tests). If you want to use this service, call 301-6000 to schedule an appointment.

Please keep your child home if they are sick. If they have a runny nose, sneezing or frequent coughing, they will need another day or two before returning. If they have lingering symptoms such as a dry cough, send them to school and ask them to wear a mask.

Lastly, teaching proper hand washing can go a long way to preventing illness! Most people only wash for a few seconds and when we should wash for 20 seconds. Many thanks!

#### REMINDER: 2022/2023 Student Cabinet Applications Now Open - Deadline Extended to 10/5/22

Dear School Leaders,

Please help the Maine Department of Education by providing this opportunity to students who would be great advocates for their peers in your region. Please note that we are especially interested in perspectives from students across a wide spectrum of diverse experiences, interests, cultures, and backgrounds. The deadline for applications to be submitted as been extended to October 5, 2022

The Maine Department of Education (DOE) is releasing applications for the 2022/2023 Student Cabinet, a group of students who will meet with Commissioner Makin throughout the 2022/23 school year to discuss educational opportunities, improvements, and policy.

In its 4th year, the Maine DOE Student Cabinet program has allowed us to integrate student voice into decision-making on education issues that impact their journey through Maine's education system. In past years, students have helped in identifying mental health needs at school, raised issues of racial equity, and helped brainstorm ways to individualize learning.

The Maine DOE is especially interested in having perspectives from students with a variety of diverse experiences, interests, cultures, and backgrounds, representing both traditional and nontraditional education pathways.

There are 16-20 seats that are currently open for students in grades 4 – 12 and first year of college. The newly selected members will serve for a term of two years, starting in October. All 16 counties in Maine are represented on the Student Cabinet.

- October 14, 2022 (In Person) Augusta 9:00am – 3:00pm
- January 5, 2023 (Virtual) Zoom 3:00pm – 4:30pm
- March 16, 2023 (Virtual) Zoom 3:00pm – 4:30pm
- May 4, 2023 (In Person) Augusta 9:00am – 3:00pm

Selected cabinet members will be expected to attend scheduled meetings, prepare for each meeting as needed, work in a collaborative manner with one another and with Department staff as needed; and express views and opinions openly, constructively, and respectfully.

### **COMPOSTING AT CRMS!!**

Some composting facts:

Food waste is the highest percentage of organic material that ends up in the landfill



When it's not composted, but instead mixed into the landfill, food waste produces methane gas — which is many times worse for the environment than carbon dioxide

Only a handful of public schools in Maine have full scale composting operations and our district is one of them!







The middle school is part of a district wide initiative to keep our food waste out of the landfills. Students in all three schools have been instructed to put their food scraps into 5 gallon buckets at the end of their lunch. Those buckets then get transported to the compost system that is at the high school. The resulting compost is used on campus in the school garden and fields and also sold to support sustainability initiatives, including wages for the students who work in the school garden in the summer.


Last year, a group of high school students, supported by Hatchery Coordinator, Danny Salomon, designed and built a few simple devices to improve our food waste operation. Since food waste decomposes faster when chopped, Mr. Salomon and his students designed and built "choppers" in varying sizes fit for three different schools. They are beautiful tools that fit the buckets perfectly. The idea is that kids chop the compost before it heads over to the high school where it is deposited in the composting site and left to transform into rich gardening material.

If you are in middle school and want to know more, there is a bulletin board explaining all of this with some photos as well. This is all part of a larger effort to integrate many sustainable practices across the district. It may seem like just a bucket full of food scraps, but there is a lot more to it!


