
Klara Mathiau did what it takes and she found the place where 89 and 98 become palindromes!

The <u>Megunticook River Citizens Advisory Council</u> has a website with in-depth information about the Megunticook River and the work being done to explore the future of the dams between the lake and the harbor. The information is in the form of videos of the monthly presentations, feasibility reports, monthly (very thorough) MRCAC newsletters,

community FAQs, a virtual tour of the watershed and committee materials. It is a rich resource for our community as we grapple with issues about the watershed and dams. Students are encouraged to take the <u>student</u> <u>survey</u> that is still available so the Committee can best understand how our community engages with the Megunticook river and lake. All MRCAC events are family friendly and students are encouraged to attend any and all speaker series!

Camden Rockport Middle School Gets Acquainted with S.E.A. Park.

The aquarium park became the focus of eight adventurous and curious 8th graders from Camden Rockport Middle School for two Wednesday mornings at the end of September and beginning of October. Our first session introduced the kids to the aquarium, how it works, what the creatures in the tank are and where they came from. Wayne explained how the tank is filled with water pumped from the harbor and we discussed the elements important to keeping the creatures healthy and hearty. The following week we excitedly pulled traps up from the float docks in the inner harbor. The students loved it and are ready for more.
